## President's Welcome



# "Communication and dedication is the key in all of this. Talk to each other...

As I begin the gift of my year as president, I am not only honored for the privilege, but excited about the year to follow. I want to thank you for the fellow leadership team I have been granted by your votes and selection that is the National Board. The talent and dedication they have is inspiring to me, and assures us a year of interesting discussions, wise choices, and smart decisions. The committees are staffed with passionate and devoted members who will bring new insights and steadfast hard work into making their committees effective in their efforts to provide AIFD with the guidance to carry us all forward. Collectively, and with all the members of AIFD, it is my wish to see us all rise to new heights as the great organization we know this to be.

For the last month or so, we have all been basking in the glow that is Symposium. It is indeed our yearly "family reunion," and this year was just as spectacular and inspiring as ever. I cannot praise the work of Lori Novak AIFD, CFD and Tom Simmons AIFD, CFD enough. They not only led this year's Symposium team, but they also were in charge of Symposium 2013 in Las Vegas, which means they have been doing the hard work of symposium for six straight years, a gargantuan task. We can only have praise and admiration of the dedication and ability it takes to do that amount of work (and do it so amazingly well), but awe of their passion in the task at hand. As Tom would say, "Amazing, amazing, amazing." Lori was also awarded our highest accolade, the "Award for Distinguished Service to AIFD," which was most appropriate and vastly deserved.

I am overjoyed to be able to attach an AIFD pin to our new inductees next year at Symposium "X." Our PFDE session this year had 114 candidates, of whom 77 earned scores high enough to become Accredited members, and all 114 became or sustained their CFD achievement status. This is almost 70% of candidates and an impressive testimony to the hard work and dedication of the candidates, as well as their mentors and instructors, for being prepared for the task. I commend Leanne Kesler AIFD, CFD and Sandy Schroeck AIFD, CFD and their team for all their hard work. We also had many additions to the Certified Evaluator and Judging Program, with kudos to Jackie Lacey AIFD, PFCI, CFD for his dedication and hard work in this area. It is a wonderful way for members to continue their education, be a Certified Judge at local and regional competitions, and to take great pride in seeing our evaluating program become a standard for floral organizations nationwide. I am thrilled to also say that our criteria and standards have been noticed by the Tournament of Roses committee and we have been asked to consult with them on the development of their criteria and standards for

award presentations. We are happy to provide advice and help in any way with those who share our passion for design excellence and objectivity and transparency in judging.

In 2014, I asked Cindy Anderson AIFD, PFCI, CFD and Wil Gonzalez AIFD, CFD to lead the Symposium team for Seattle 2017. My only request to them was to freely think "outside the box" and to plan a Symposium that would reflect us as a vibrant organization and also reflect our host city as a vibrant cosmopolitan metropolis and forward thinking technology hub. Their choice of a name, "X," to reflect their thematic adjectives ("Xquisite," "Xtraordinary," etc.), is right in line with that thought, and I greatly anticipate an "Xcellent" Symposium Seattle 2017! It is our 50th Symposium as an organization, and I am looking forward to being dazzled by what they and their Symposium team comes up with. #### Partners in the Success of AIFD

Before all the excitement and inspiration of the National Symposium got underway, the dedicated volunteer leaders of AIFD convened to conduct the summer meetings of the Board of Directors.

President Joyce Mason-Monheim AIFD, PFCI, CFD called the meeting to order and quickly saw to the acceptance of its agenda, the minutes of the meeting held in Baltimore on April 4 and the Consent Agenda.

Treasurer **Tom Simmons AIFD, CFD** then reviewed the May 31, 2016 financial statements with the instruction that they be presented for year-end audit by the Institute's third-party CPA.

Staff reports and recommendations from retiring Executive Director Tom Shaner and Associate Executive Director Kristen Philips, CAE were then presented. Included in their presentation were a review of the new Life Member cumulative recognition system, a reminder of and encouragement to participate with the Random Acts of Flowers program, and a review of the various chapter board lists so that they can be accurately published in the 2016-2017 Membership Directory. Ms. Philips then reported on the status of the CFD program being offered to students who complete specified courses at Education Partners and in so doing announced that all communications and promotions of this exciting new venture would begin immediately following the current Symposium.

At this point in the meeting, after 35 years of service to AIFD, Mr. Shaner announced that he was officially turning the position of Executive Director over to Ms. Philips. The board gave overwhelming thanks to Mr. Shaner for his 35 years of outstanding service and dedication to the organization.

Membership Chairperson Leanne Kesler AIFD, CFD then presented her report which included a list of new Laureates since the previous Symposium, as well as a review of the status of membership renewals for both the 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 years. She presented the list of members who as a result of not having paid 2015-2016 membership fees were subject to being dropped from membership as stipulated in the Institute Bylaws and Policies. The Board agreed to remove, with regret, from the membership of this organization all those who have not remitted their 2015-2016 membership fees and to include a list of all such persons with the filing of the minutes of this meeting.

Ms. Kesler then reported that the Institute had received letters of resignation from **Sharon Kantor**, **Sarah Horne**, **Dean Yale**, and **Charles Jordan** due to retirements.

Ms. Kesler then reviewed the list of those CFDs who have not renewed their 2015 CEUS due June 15, 2015, as well as those CFDs who have not renewed their 2016 CEUs due June 15, 2016 and therefore placed on suspended status. It was agreed, as stipulated in the Bylaws of this organization, to remove from the Certified Floral Designer roles of this organization all those CFDs who have not remitted their 2015 CEUs.

On the recommendation of the Awards Committee, it was then agreed, as per policy, to direct the Secretary to add the names of the recipients of this year's awards as determined in the April 4, 2016 meeting of this Board to the minutes of this meeting. Focal Points 4

The Awards report and action was followed by the Student Membership Committee which recommended, and the Board agreed, to move College of Sequoias back to an inactive SAIFD chapter and move Johnson County Community College to an active SAIFD Chapter.



Symposium was the next

subject dealt with by the volunteer leaders. First Lori Novak AIFD, CFD presented a final report of plans for the 2016 National Symposium in Orange County. She was followed by Cindy Anderson AIFD, PFCI, CFD and Wil Gonzalez AIFD, CFD who reviewed early plans for the 2017 National Symposium which will be held in Seattle, Wash.

Ms. Philips then reported that on the request of the board, and in order to adhere to the three city rotation policy for future Symposia, she was able to negotiate and secure a favorable contract with the Wardman Park Marriott Hotel in Washington D.C. for 2021.

At this point, the final meeting of the 2015-2016 National Board of Directors was adjourned. Ms. Mason-Monheim called for a 15 minute break before calling to order the first meeting of the 2016-2017 Board for the special purpose of electing officers and adopting appropriate banking resolutions (necessary to reflect change of authorization signatures). With the new directors seated and voting, Ms. Mason-Monheim turned the meeting over to Past President Tim Farrell AIFD, CFD who served as chairman of the Nominating Committee.

Announcing that no dissent had been given by the members of the Board, Mr. Farrell reported that **Kim Oldis AIFD, CFD** would move into the position of President-Elect and **Anthony Vigliotta AIFD, CFD** would become the next President of the Board of AIFD.

Mr. Farrell then presented the name of **Frank Feysa AIFD**, **PFCI**, **CFD** and **Jackie Lacey AIFD**, **PFCI**, **CFD** as the candidates nominated for the office of Vice President. After hearing from each candidate, the Board voted and Mr. Feysa was elected the new Vice President.

Mr. Farrell then presented the names of **David Shover AIFD, PFCI, CFD** and **Katie McCormick AIFD, CFD** as the candidates nominated by the Committee. Mr. Lacey was also nominated. Again, each candidate addressed the Board before a first ballot was taken. On the third ballot, Mr. Lacey was elected the new Secretary. Having been elected Vice President, Mr. Feysa resigned his position as Director-at-Large. President Vigliotta then recommended that **Alex Jackson AIFD, CFD** be appointed to fill the vacancy as a Director-At-Large created by the election of Mr.



Feysa to Vice President and finish the term remaining of one year. It was moved and seconded to approve such an appointment.

With the election of the new officers it was moved and seconded that all banking resolutions necessary to reflect the names of the new officers for the purpose of bank signatures be adopted. The motion passed unanimously.

The next meeting of the National Board will be held in Washington, DC in October.

## AIFD Announces New Executive Director

Philips replaces long time Executive Director Thomas C. Shaner who is retiring after serving the Institute for over 35 years.

Philips is no stranger to the floral industry; she has worked with the American Institute of Floral Designers for 11 years. As the Associate Executive Director she has guided the organization through many changes including the creation and expansion of the Certified Floral Designer (CFD®) program and creating and implementing the cutting-edge electronic evaluating scoring system for the association's Professional Floral Design Evaluation.

Highly motivated and experienced for the position as Executive Director, Ms. Philips was awarded by AIFD's National Board of Directors in 2014 with the Special Award of Recognition for her loyalty and dedication to the association and its mission to advance the art of professional floral design through education, service and leadership.

"Ms. Philips has an outstanding reputation with AIFD," commented Vigliotta. "We look forward to seeing all of the great things she is capable of in the years to come."

Ms. Philips graduated from the University of Baltimore, Summa Cum Laude, and shortly thereafter completed her studies at the Institute for Organization Management, a 4-year program of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce focused on nonprofit professional development for association professionals. Ms. Philips also obtained her CAE designation (Certified Association Executive) from the American Society of Association Executives (ASAE).

"Tom Shaner has in many ways helped shape AIFD to be what it is today," said Philips. "While I know that I have big shoes to fill, I look forward to the future of the organization and the goals that we can achieve together that will continue to benefit the floral design industry. I'm honored to have the opportunity to work with the dedicated volunteer leadership, and the extremely talented group of floral design artists, educators, and industry supporters who make up the AIFD membership, and to continue to support the mission of AIFD by advancing the art of professional floral design," said Philips.







## Everything You Need to Know:

elicate daffodils and other spring flowers are just a memory by the time summer arrives. But you won't miss them when you grow flamboyant parrot tulips, which boldly take center stage later in the growing season.

Parrot tulips are flamboyant with their curly, twisted, and fringed petals that resemble the colorful feathers of the tropical bird of the same name. However, their beak-shape buds are what earned them their moniker. Nearly all varieties of parrot tulip are vibrantly colored, and many are two-toned. Parrot tulips are named for their bright colors, which look as if they've been painted onto the ruffled petals. You can find these flowers in almost every hue, including orange, red,

violet, indigo, pink, yellow and near black. Some varieties are available in solid colors, while others are marked with multicolored stripes and splashes.

Developed from mutations of late-flowering tulips, the parrot types first appeared in 17th century France and made their way to the Netherlands about a century later. Today they're hardy to the U.S. in zones 4 through 7.

Because the flowers are delicate, parrot tulips need to be planted where they'll be protected from strong winds. They're also vulnerable to extremes of heat and cold. Try growing them near the side of your house to help shelter them, or grow them in pots you can move indoors.

While parrot tulips may need extra care, they're worth the trouble. Most are unscented, but some, like 'Orange Favorite', 'Blue Parrot' and 'Blumex Favorite' have sweet perfumes.

Plant parrot tulips from early fall into November for mid- to late-spring blooms. They need full sun and well-drained soil. Place the bulbs 5 inches deep and 4 to 6 inches apart, and water them thoroughly. Mulch them for the winter, and remove the mulch when they sprout in spring.

Parrot tulips don't need supplemental watering until active growth begins. Then water weekly and feed monthly with a 10-10-10 fertilizer.

Wait until the flowers fade and the leaves die back naturally to dig up the bulbs. Store them in a warm, dry location until fall's cooler temperatures arrive, when you can replant them outdoors.



#### Symposium Through the Ages...

Symposium in a delightful plush hotel, pool, room service, Internet connections, with all the amenities, and a great Disney vacation experience in Anaheim, Calif., not so in the beginning...

In 1965 there wasn't even a college that had a full time floral design professor! Finally, in 1967 Bob Gordon AIFD, CFD was hired by Cal Poly in San Luis Obispo. The Ornamental Horticulture Department established a four-year curriculum with Bob at the helm.

Cal Poly hosted the first symposium in 1968 under the direction of **Art Ito AIFD**, then vice president of AIFD, with the aid of Bob to create a program that incorporated students and the beginnings of SAIFD.



By 1977 Symposiums were still held on college campuses. No beautiful linens and room service! Attendees slept in campus dormitories in bunks and dined in the cafeteria. After each day of programs there would be sing-a-long's in someone's room. **Frankie Shelton AIFD** remembers sitting on the floor listening to **Jef Hackbart AIFD** tell everyone about his fabulous clients, the stars of Hollywood



Frankie shared her experiences; when she chaired the Symposium in Houston, Texas in 1979 which moved the Symposium venue a bit more to the central part of the USA. "There was no home office at the time, so I booked the Shamrock Hotel, selected the designers, had all props shipped to my school. I paid the designers \$100.00 each. My husband took care of the reservations and confirmations. My children were in hospitality and I got many donations of flowers and materials. I was given \$3,000.00 for expenses. We had a fabulous turnout of 350 attendees and I broke even with no additional expense."
